

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DAY ONE-ARRIVAL IN FLORENCE

ARRIVAL BY TRAIN

Be sure you are arriving at Santa Maria Novella Station.

- As you exit the tracks, turn left. Exit the train station and find the taxi station to the left at the back
- of the station. You can only obtain taxis here, not by flagging them on the street. Use an official taxi (white) and ask how much before you get in.
- Walking is an option, but keep this in mind: Wheeling luggage over cobblestones is not easy expecially if you have heavy luggage.

ARRIVAL BY PLANE

- Make a choice for how you will transport yourself into central Florence: If you haven't already, this is good place to exchange dollars for euros.
- TAXI COST: \$22 + more for bags. Use official taxis (white) and always ask how much it will cost before you get in. Takes about 10 minutes and will take you directly to your accommodation.
- IF YOU ARE A WOMAN ALONE AT NIGHT THIS IS THE RECOMMENDED MODE OF TRAVEL.
- TRAM (TRAM T2): COST \$3. May be additional luggage charges. Runs every 5-10 minutes, 5:00 AM to midnight. Takes about 20 minutes and will take you to Santa Maria Novella Train Station. From there, you may need a taxi if you have a lot of luggage.

ARRIVAL BY CAR

- Driving in central Florence is not permitted, so this would be a perfect place to return your rental car. If you are keeping your car, be sure your accommodation has parking spaces. Then provide
- your car license plate number to your hotel, who will notify the local police, and you will receive a temporary permit to enter the ZTL (No Traffic Zone). The hotel will provide further information.

WHERE TO NEXT?

This is up to you, depending on the time of your arrival.

- Check into your accommodation. Remember you will need your passport for this step.
- Then...Begin to explore Florence on your own.
- Cross the Ponte Vecchio and enjoy the ambiance. Stop and have an aperitivo (appetizer).
- Dinner Suggestion: <u>Trattoria 4 Leone</u> in the Oltrarno district (which you have booked via email from home). Have the pear pasta!

 - OR extend your trip to Siena, Pisa, Lucca, and San Gigmignano..



Montepulciano to San Quirico Via Pienza

Starting in Montepulciano, follow SP 146 toward Pienza. Look for a sign to your premier picnic spot, and farm, Cucusi Silvana. Continue on to Pienza, one of our favorites. See our article on Pienza (Pg.13). HInt: Continue on SP 146 and look for Chapel of Madonna of Vitaleta, You can see it from the road, or walk closer.

Follow SS 2 to Via Della Circonvallazione, then SP 14 to Montalccino.

Via Monticchiello Follow SP 18 and SP88 to Montepulciano, taking the turnoff to Monticchiello. An easy route allowing browsing time in all three towns.

Senior and stroller alert:

Pienza is easiest for walking, Monticchiello has a slight incline and Montepulciano is steep! (Sometimes golf carts are available in Montepulciano 1 near the city gates for a cost).


